There are currently **40** students from **14** countries on **5** continents enrolled. Call Me MISTER supports men of color pursuing a teaching degree.

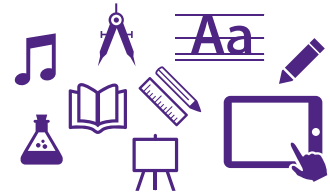
