Well-qualified leaders are critical who are equipped to address the daunting issues facing our nation's community colleges. Our country needs community college leaders who are passionate about serving students so they can achieve their educational and career dreams. The CCLP is designed to provide an innovative approach to a **DOCTOR OF EDUCATION (EdD)** for those seeking to enhance their competence in leading transformation at community colleges and to provide leadership and organizational development for sustained contributions to the college, district, and communities they serve. The program is housed in the Department of Educational Leadership, College of Education at K-State, with program offices at the Roueche Center in Austin, TX, and cohorts located throughout the United States.

The CCLP is offered in a **COHORT MODEL** to encourage collaborative learning and networking. In addition to professors who meet on the local community college campus for the blended classes, a

local cohort coordinator, with an earned doctoral degree, provides ongoing support to doctoral students and faculty throughout the program.

The professors and other national leaders interact weekly with students via **ZOOM**, making this program highly accessible to working professionals. The classes will be augmented with online/Canvas instruction and assignments. Each eight-week course will also include two Friday afternoons and Saturdays.

The primary features of the program have been created in collaboration with community college leaders across the country. The CCLP instruction includes a combination of sessions with community college experts, teleconferencing with national leaders, teamwork and interaction, topical webinars, and practicums to address emerging college, district, and/or system issues. The CCLP focuses on early exploration of issues that lend themselves to a dissertation. In addition, the research and dissertation development courses support the creation and completion of applied research and dissertations, with the guidance of faculty.

The CCLP is designed to complete core courses in two years and proceed with the dissertation development in year three. There are two in-person five-day leadership institutes which include community and college site and association visits, and a strategic capstone initiative completed prior to starting the dissertation journey under instructor and dissertation committee guidance.

A Program Overview Guide is provided which maps course sequencing and will be reviewed at the information session. As the cohort gets underway, we will also convene a CCLP Orientation on May 8. Make certain to mark your calendar for this important date!

Program participants will be prepared to:

- Create and foster a culture focused on community college student learning, equity, success, and completion;
- Lead institutional transformation and foster innovation; and,
- Develop a competitive advantage through national networks of colleagues.

The CCLP is designed to:


- Focus all courses on community college culture and issues;
- Engage professors who are nationally known leaders and have had successful careers as
 chancellors, presidents, provosts, senior faculty in the community college movement to teach
 future generations of community college leaders;
- Convene cohorts of students to encourage collaboration and engagement;


- Bring the courses and the professors to the cohort;
