

Teaching outside of Kansas?

You are required to have a teaching license in the state in which you are teaching. Every state is responsible for determining their own requirements. Generally, it is easier to get licensed in other states if you are licensed in the state that prepared you. K-State's College of Education is state, regionally, and nationally accredited. Most states will accept the Kansas license to get you at least a temporary teaching license while you complete any extra requirements (typically a state-specific class or test).
